TIPS FOR FAMILY MATH ACTIVITIES

An important way families can help support their children's mathematical thinking and understanding is by showing them how much we all use math in our day to day lives. Numbers are all around us! Kindergarten and first grade students can start to learn all the numbers related to themselves. How old are they? How many people are there in their family? If you invite friends over for dinner, how many more chairs will you need at the table? An older student can help you estimate how much your basket of groceries will be at the check out stand. How do you decide which products are the best deal? Talk to your children about budgeting and how to plan ahead for big purchases. Another important mathematical concept is time. If children need 10+ hours of sleep each night, what time should they go to bed? Have fun figuring out all the ways we use math without even realizing it!
